YOUR CAMP

Camp Geronimo is located beneath the majestic Mogollon Rim near Pine, Arizona. If traveling from the Phoenix Metropolitan area, allow about 2 ½ hours driving time.

Each of the twenty-nine campsites at Camp Geronimo is secluded under tall, cool ponderosa pine trees. Each campsite has an adirondak, picnic tables, a ramada, a latrine and washstand, fire circle and a flagpole. A number of standard BSA wall tents and platforms complete the campsite.

Other facilities at the camp include a trading post, hot showers, an obstacle course, a climbing tower, swimming pool, a small lake, and extensive, Handicraft, Nature and Outdoor Skills programs. Camp Geronimo also hosts great shooting sports facilities for smallbore rifles, muzzleloading rifles and archery. Another favorite program available at Camp Geronimo is horseback riding.

Camp Geronimo also has great food at the camp dining hall. Troops, if they wish, also have the opportunity to provide their own meals for the week.

Camp Geronimo also has a variety of scenic hiking trails for Scouts to experience. Special hiking awards can also be earned.

SCOUTS ADVANCE AT CAMP

Camp Geronimo offers an exciting advancement program to compliment your troop's year-round advancement program. The camp staff is available to assist Scouts in working towards earning a variety of fun and exciting merit badges in a relaxed setting.

The Trail Begins program allows young Scouts to work on many of the requirements towards their Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class ranks.

Merit badge classes are offered in the morning and require advance registration. Merit badge subjects offered include:
